### **LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT FOR SOCIAL CHANGE**

ON 27-28 JULY, 2010, the U.P. Center for Leadership, Citizenship and Democracy (UP CLCD) actively participated in the conference, "Leadership Development for Social Change: Building a Community of Practice." Director Lily Domingo served as speaker-facilitator while CLCD staff Lydia Angeles, Mariz Odulio and Don Quebral were coordinators and rapporteurs in the said event.

Several organizations composed the organizing committee. Among them were Asian Institute of Management (AIM) Team Energy Center for Bridging Societal Divides, Ateneo de Manila University (AdMU) Development Studies Program, Ateneo School of Government (ASG), Ayala Foundation Inc. (Education and Leadership Department), La Salle Institute of Governance (LSIG), and Galing Pook Foundation.

The conference was an opportunity for leaders and practitioners in the academe, government, civil society, and private individuals to come together and share their expertise in a community of leaders.

### **PHILIPPINE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS (PCP)**

THE CENTER is currently writing the terminal report of its involvement with the Philippine College of Physicians (PCP). The Center helped the PCP in its conduct of a planning workshop and organization development activities. This was held on 4-5 June 2010 in Tagaytay.

### **PAMANA**

THIS YEAR, another significant publication will be added to the Center's list of PAMANA series.

THE BOOK on Economic Development in the Philippines edited by Dr. Felipe Medalla is the seventh of the Center's multidisciplinary research and publication project called **PAMANA: The U.P.**

**Anthology of Filipino Socio-Political Thought Since 1872.** This scholarly and non-profit project aims at organizing and editing 20 books to be published by the University of the Philippines Press.

As part of the verification phase on the materials and references used, the Center is currently seeking oral and written permission from the authors of each material. The book is expected to come out before the end of October.

### **IN THE PIPELINE**

#### **ALTERNATIVE ASSESSMENT ON THE ARROYO ADMINISTRATION (2004-2010)**

THE CENTER continues to pursue its commitment to provide a record and legacy of each outgoing administration which began in 1992. For the second time now, the Center will come up with an alternative assessment for the Arroyo Administration (2004-2010), the first being President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo's first term which ended in 2004.

Originally, two publications result out of the U.P. Public Lectures which include administration's report and the alternative assessment of the administration. Since the Arroyo administration came up with its own legacy report, the Center will hence provide the alternative assessment. Experts from the academe will do the assessment.

Similar publication was done for the administrations Aquino and Ramos respectively.

#### **A FREE SEMINAR-WORKSHOP ON LEADERSHIP**

THE CENTER is now preparing for a two-day seminar-workshop on leadership to be conducted by Dr. Edwin J. Portugal. Dr. Portugal is a visiting Fulbright Specialist and Professor from the State University of New York at Potsdam, USA.
